## Celebrate Arbor Day at Salisbury Park!

Come lend a hand and experience the Arbor Day Celebration on Saturday, April 25! Parker Parks and Recreation will be celebrating by planting trees at Salisbury Park starting at 9 a.m. You're invited to help plant around 40 trees of various species, including smaller ornamentals, shade trees and evergreens. There's no need to sign up, just bring your own gloves and shovel. The Town will provide donuts, coffee and hot chocolate!

After the tree planting, be sure to stop by the arborist table and meet the Town's Parks and Forestry team. They can answer questions about tree planting, pruning and selection. Learn how to take care of your trees and make them last. Kids will also have the opportunity to build and take home a bird house, courtesy of Home Depot!

Arbor Day is a fun, educational event for the whole family and is an important piece to keeping Parker named as a "Tree City USA." The Tree City USA® program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in cooperation with the USDA

Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters. Parker has been named as a Tree City USA for each of the last 22 years! In order to maintain this title, a commitment must be made to enhance the public's awareness of trees within the community through events and educational opportunities such as the annual Arbor Day Celebration.

Please remember that the Town will not be providing shovels at Arbor Day. Tree planting, refreshments and give-a-ways will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. ## Remember Garage Sale Sign Guidelines

Parker Town Council updated the Town's sign code in July 2013 to allow for "limited duration and temporary signs," which include signs advertising garage sales. These signs are now permitted in the right-of-way for a limited period of time under the following conditions.

- A maximum of four signs are permitted per residential lot.
- The signs may only be posted beginning at noon on Thursdays through 7 p.m. on the following Sunday.
- The signs may not exceed 5 square feet per face and 4 feet in height.

- The signs cannot be attached to public utility poles, traffic and other directional signs, vehicles, utility boxes, fences, other structures or trees.
- The signs cannot be placed in medians, roadways, shoulders or bike paths/lanes.
- Signs must be located 50 feet from all intersections and at least 6 feet from the edge of the roadway.
- Signs must be located at least 10 feet from any other garage sale sign.

As part of this program, the Town's Neighborhood Services Division has pre-approved Garage Sale signs available for purchase at Town Hall.

## ***Parker Police Earn Public Safety Communications Accreditation***

Police Chief David King is proud to announce that the Town of Parker Police Department has been awarded the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA) Public Safety Communications Accreditation. This is the fourth accreditation the Department has been awarded since 2013.

The Parker Police Department is the first law enforcement agency in the nation to be awarded the following four accreditations: CALEA Law Enforcement, CALEA Public Safety Communications, International Association for Property and Evidence (IAPE) and state accreditation through the Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police.

Individually, these awards show how the Police Department is dedicated to operating at the highest of standards. When you combine them, it proves beyond a measure of doubt that the organization lives by its vision statement:

***The Parker Police Department strives to adhere to the highest standards and reflect the diversity of its community members. The people of our community and members of the Police Department must be united in their commitment to addressing crime, violence and quality-of-life issues by engaging one another in problem-solving partnerships. Recognizing that integrity is the foundation of our profession, we endeavor to preserve and protect the public trust placed in us by adhering to the highest standards of honesty and ethical practice.***

The purpose of becoming an accredited agency is to ensure the department has the most up-to-date policies, procedures

and trainings – recognizing professional excellence. For each one of these accreditations, the Parker Police must maintain compliance with applicable standards, keep proofs of compliance and live by the letter and spirit of those standards, then go through the process of maintaining accreditation on a regular basis. The Department is always auditing practices and bringing in outside assessors from around the country to perform regular audits.

### **About the CALEA Accreditations**

The purpose of CALEA's accreditation programs is to improve the delivery of public safety services, primarily by: maintaining a body of standards, developed by public safety practitioners, covering a wide range of up-to-date public safety initiatives; establishing and administering an accreditation process; and recognizing professional excellence. The law enforcement accreditation requires the department be in compliance with CALEA's 317 mandatory policing standards, as well as at least 80 optional standards. The public safety communications accreditation focuses on 165 mandatory standards.

### **About the IAPE Accreditation**

This accreditation is a review of the Property and Evidence Section's standards, documentation, procedures and actions as they relate to the industry's best practices.

### **About the CACP Accreditation**

CACP accreditation requires a law enforcement agency to demonstrate and consistently maintain compliance with over 200 professional standards of performance. Some of these standard areas include arrest procedures, community relations, internal affairs, investigations, record keeping, patrol operations and code of ethics.

## The Season is Approaching to Deal With Unsightly Weeds

Spring and summer means grass and weeds will be growing, and with all the moisture we tend see in the spring, you can expect them to be growing tall before you know it!

The Town would like to remind Parker residents about our municipal ordinance dealing with weeds and tall grass. Any non-native grass or weeds over 12 inches tall must be cut. We request that noxious weeds be pulled or sprayed as mowing them won't remove the threat of spreading.

We also ask that all residents take a moment and look over their front, side and back yards to ensure they are free from tall grass and weeds. If your property does have tall grass and weeds, please take care of them as quickly as possible and continue to maintain your property throughout the year. Any violation of this ordinance could result in a fine up to \$499 per day that the violation exists.

Undeveloped property is permitted to grow native and other acceptable vegetation to their naturally occurring heights. This practice is essential for accepted erosion-



control practices, wildlife habitat and natural suppression of weeds. Please contact Neighborhood Services regarding undeveloped fields.

Thank you in advance for inspecting your property to ensure that you are not in violation of this municipal ordinance. ## Parker Teen Court Welcomes New Members

The Town of Parker is proud to announce that 25 students were sworn into Parker Teen Court on March 5 at Town Hall. With nearly 100 people in attendance, the new members and their families celebrated with dinner and cake following the ceremony. The eager teens officially join Teen Court after successfully completing General Legal Training, which covered topics such as juvenile justice, the court system and criminal law, ethics, the impact of crime and restorative justice.

Teen Court provides teens with the opportunity to be directly involved in the justice system while making a positive impact on the Parker community and their peers. Members determine appropriate sanctions for first-time juvenile offenders in either a peer panel or trial setting. Cases are heard on a weekly basis at Parker Town Hall.

Since 2005, Parker Teen Court has been an integral part of dealing with youth offenders in the community and now has a roster of over 100 trained volunteers. It is a community-based intervention/prevention program designed to provide an alternative response to the juvenile justice system for first-time, nonviolent, misdemeanor juvenile offenders ages 12 to 17 years old.
