

Council Candidate Biography: Terry Dodd

What is your occupation?

I have been in the real estate and construction management industries for 40+ years. I became an employing broker in Colorado in 1979. I am an active real estate broker and enjoy assisting my clients with design-build custom homes and renovations.

Which subdivision do you live in and how long have you lived there?

We have owned our home in Rowley Downs since June of 2001. I moved to Colorado in 1978 and have lived in the Town of Parker for 20 years.

What other governmental service have you been involved in?

What made you decide to run for Town Council?
