

Mental Health Resources

A note for those seeking services:

To continue to meet the needs of the community and those patients requiring admission to residential levels of care or utilizing walk in crisis services, while limiting the possibility of contributing to poor outcomes for individuals at highest risk due to COVID-19 exposure, all facilities are completing a screening process that will ask about various risk factors (travel, exposure, symptoms, comorbidities, age, etc). Anyone experiencing symptoms should contact their medical professional.

All counseling services are being delivered via telehealth capabilities.
