Occasionally other short-term commissions and task forces are formed to work on various issues. For more information, please call 303.841.0353.

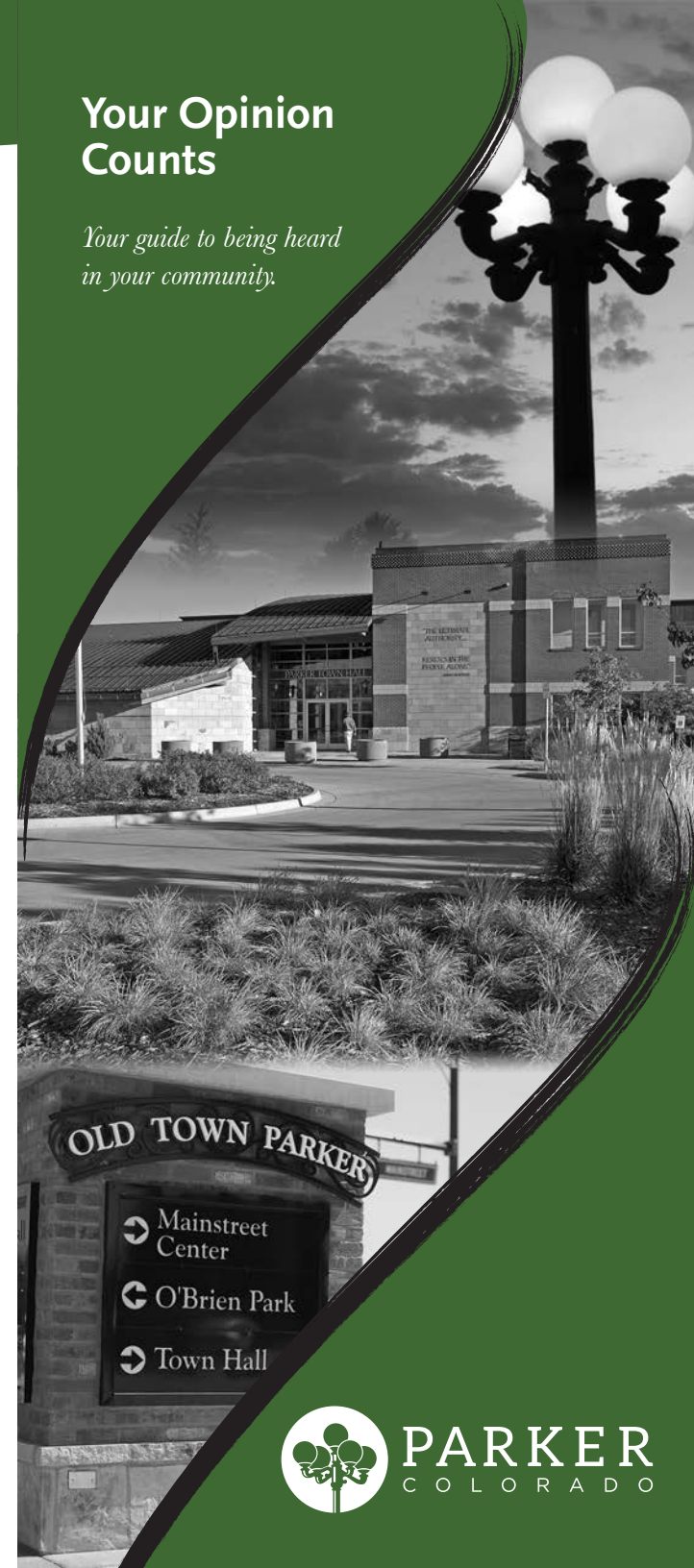

## Town Council Meetings

Attending Council meetings is an effective way to make your voice heard in your community and become informed about what's going on in Parker. These meetings are always open to the public and all residents are encouraged to attend. Regular Council meetings are held at Town Hall, 20120 E. Mainstreet, on the first and third Monday of each month at 7 p.m., excluding holidays.

Town Council meeting agendas are posted at Town Hall the Friday prior to the meeting. A tentative agenda is also printed in the local paper. Agendas may also be accessed on the Town's Web site at [www.parkeronline.org/agendas](http://www.parkeronline.org/agendas) or picked up at Town Hall the Friday prior to the meeting.

Time is allowed at each Council meeting for public comments on any topic of community interest that is not already on the agenda. There is a three-minute time limit on these comments. Even if you do not wish to speak on an issue, attending these meetings is a great way to find out what is happening in your community.

Public hearings on various topics are also held at Town Council meetings. During these hearings, community members are able to comment on specific agenda items. Council takes the comments made during these hearings into consideration when making their final decision on any issue.

The Planning Commission also holds public hearings on a variety of land use and related development issues. Agendas are posted at

Town Hall and at the Community Development Department the Friday prior to each meeting.

## Sign up for Town Email

The Town offers citizens the chance to sign up for free email updates about different Town departments and activities. You can choose to receive emails about topics including citizen involvement, events, recreation, public safety and roads.
